- Presentation on Research Paper :: 10 Max. Marks
- Written Test (Open Book) :: 10 Max. Marks

Research Paper Writing :: 10 Max. Marks

- Each and every LL.M. student has to write one research paper as an internal component for each subject i.e. four research papers for four courses.
- The topic will be composed and selected by student, the same will be finalized and approved by the subject/course faculty in email communication as a record. Approval of the topic by the concerned faculty will be done in 24 hrs. from submission. The same is to be sent to the Email ID of the concerned faculty and c.c. to LL.M. Admin. The same is provide below.
- The topic of research paper must be directly related to the core subject/course of the LL.M. Sem. I only.
- The Footnoting style to be followed for the research paper is the JILI citation style (<https://www.ili.ac.in/footnoting>).

General Rules for submitting the research paper ::

- **Software :: Main Text- Submissions must** be in MS Word.
- **Font, Size, Spacing, Formatting ::** Times New Roman, font size 12, spacing 1.5 and justified with a margin of 1.5 inch in left and 1.0 inch in right, top and bottom.
- **Footnoting Style ::** Foot Notes- Footnoting style to be followed for the research paper is the JILI citation style (<https://www.ili.ac.in/footnoting>)
- **Word Limit ::** The word limit for Research Papers is between **6000 to 9000 words** (including footnotes). The word limit must be strictly adhered to.
- **Academic Integrity & Ethics ::** Quotations or reproducing literature from court judgements and other literature is permitted subject to the strict adherence to the University Grants Commission (***Promotion of Academic Integrity and Prevention of Plagiarism in Higher Educational Institutions Regulations, 2018***), and the Quality Mandate adopted by the UGC.
- **Plagiarism % age ::** Percentage of similarity (plagiarism) must not go beyond the limits prescribed by the *UGC rules and guidelines* and as prescribed by the relevant rules/policies of the CCS University.
- **Plagiarism Exclusion ::** Plagiarism is checked by Lloyd Law College through Turnitin. Similarity checks for exclusion from Plagiarism. The similarity checks for plagiarism shall exclude the following:
 - All quoted work either falling under public domain or reproduced with all necessary permission and/or attribution.
 - All small similarities of minor nature.
- **The Research Scholar has to take care of following points ::**
 - Originality of the theme,
 - Novelty of the subject,
 - Clarity of the idea,
 - Presentation of subject systematically,
 - Linkage of conclusion with the contents.
- **Zero Tolerance Policy in core area ::**
 - The core work carried out by the student shall be based on original ideas and shall be covered by Zero Tolerance Policy on Plagiarism.
 - An Originality Certificate that the paper submitted is a piece of original and bonafide research work and has not been published or submitted for publication elsewhere has to be submitted.



Presentation on Research Paper :: 10 Max. Marks

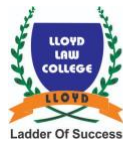
- There will be presentation on (all 04 papers) each subject / course Research Paper as Submitted.
