Intellectual Property Rights Professional Training Program ::

“The Story of Indian intellectual property (IP) law is a saga in its own right. Despite being an area of law impacting everyone’s access to medicine, technology, books, music, and movies, IP in India has historically been regarded as an esoteric subject, one that has no room in public debate. Over the past decade, though, this narrative has altered dramatically: student led protests after academic publishers sued a photocopy shop in the University of Delhi (DU); judicial websites hacked in disapproval of court imposed band on access to filesharing websites; resellers lobbying for parallel imports; Bollywood producers threatening strikes to oppose mandatory royalty sharing with composers; and rallies by payment groups during the Glivec case are some of the recent examples where the IP debate has spilled onto the streets. Several of these confrontations would have been unimaginable 60 years ago, when it was mainly the government driving Indian IP policy. The deepening of democracy, an expanding middle class, and a new breed of academics, lawyers, and activists have pushed IP into the spotlight of public debate.”
