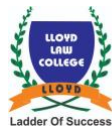
PREAMBLE

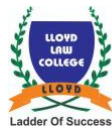


- II. Applicant will have to participate in both, i.e. Written Test (**35 Marks**) and Personal Interview (**15 Marks**).
- III. The Written test shall have objective questions (MCQ) as well as subjective questions (written). Combined Merit List will be prepared, and selected candidates will be informed via mails.
- IV. Objective of selection process is to test the applicant's basic knowledge of civil procedural law and other civil laws.
- V. Only **fifty (50) applicant** students will be selected to participate in the Competition starting with "Submission of Fact Sheet".
- VI. Different Workshops shall be conducted for selected candidates during the course of the Competition.

GUIDELINES RELATED TO THE TEST

1. There shall be two screening tests. One is **Written Test [35 Marks]** and the other is **Personal Interview [15 Marks]**.
2. The written test shall be **problem based in Open Book Test Method**.
3. An applicant shall not be allowed more than one attempt.
4. All the batches will be given same question paper; however, the set may vary.
5. Applicants can use bare acts of Code of Civil Procedure, 1908, Indian Evidence Act, 1872 or/and any other study material during the test.
6. Applicant present at Written Test will be provided deemed attendance for the classes they miss for the test duration.
