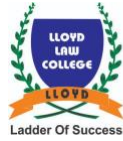

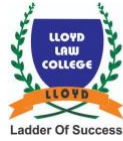
PREAMBLE

- ❖ To learn theory and practice.

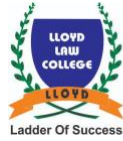

- II. Applicant will have to participate in both, i.e. Written Test (**35 Marks**) and Personal Interview (**15 Marks**).

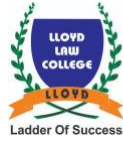


- III. The Written test shall have objective as well as subjective questions. Combined Merit List will be prepared, and selected candidates will be informed via mails.
- IV. Objective of selection process is to test the applicant's basic knowledge of civil procedural law and other civil laws.
- V. Only **thirty applicant** students will be selected to participate in the Competition starting with "Submission of Fact Sheet".
- VI. Different Workshops shall be conducted for selected candidates during the course of the Competition.

GUIDELINES RELATED TO THE TEST

1. There shall be two screening tests. One is Written Test [35 Marks] and the other is Personal Interview [15 Marks].
2. The written test shall be through an Open Book Method.
3. An applicant shall not be allowed more than one attempt.
4. All the batches will be given same question paper; however, the set may vary.
5. The structure of written test is as follows:
