Sudhir Mishra completed his graduation in History from Deshbandhu College, Delhi University. Thereafter in 1998, he finished his degree in Law from Campus Law Centre, Delhi University. Soon after graduation, he started his own law firm, Trust Legal, which specialises in environmental, health, financial services, securitisation, banking, oil and gas law practice, as well as alternative dispute resolution.

Mr. Mishra talked to the students in very interactive manner and sharpened their creative interest. He made them explore their own innovative mind and inspired them to think outside the box. Mr Mishra told the students that for the development of entrepreneurship skills, a person need not be well established or monetarily sound. He then discussed the various startups by students and how their roars of success are spread all across.
